SB 353	Alpert	Authorizes the construction of a new office building and related facilities in the City of San Diego.	81,000,000
SB 771	Figueroa	Establishes a "do not call" list for telephone subscribers who do not want to receive telephone solicitations.	2,200,000
SB 809	Ortiz	Authorizes the Dept. of General Services to acquire real property, construct multi-tenant office and parking facilities within the Capitol Area Plan in the City of Sacramento.	32,000,000
SB 1177	Polanco	Appropriates funds for the acquisition, planning, design, environmental assessment and cleanup of the 32-acre parcel known as the "Cornfield" rail yards in the City of Los Angeles.	1,000,000
